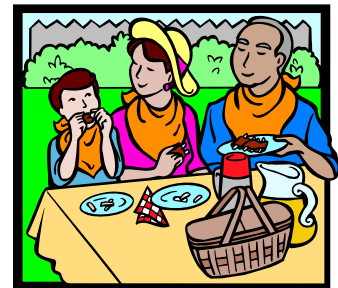
We extend to you and your friends a warm welcome to join us as we continue our year of God's blessings of friendship and fellowship.

## Mission & Outreach

**The Pottstown Cluster of Religious Communities Purchases the George A. Amole American Legion Post Home at 57 N. Franklin Street**

The Pottstown Cluster of Religious Communities (PCRC) has purchased the George A. Amole American Legion Post Home at 57 N. Franklin Street, providing more space for its food and clothing operations that reach thousands of Pottstown area residents each year.

The building was acquired to move the Cluster Outreach

Center, PCRC's primary program site, to a larger facility, stated George Bell, PCRC board president. The official sale occurred Jan. 28, 2010, "The building had been zoned Traditional Town Neighborhood and, as such, required us to apply for a variance to use the property as we intend," Bell said. "The variance, which was approved April 21st, allows us to implement renovations and move to this new site as quickly as possible.

For more than 15 years, PCRC has searched for a building that would offer more space to meet the needs of its programs and allow room to grow, Barbara Wilhelmy, PCRC executive director noted. "The American Legion property has more than twice the amount of space as our current facility at 137 Walnut Street, allowing program growth, safer work areas for our staff and volunteers and a greater presence in the community.

"More importantly, with the increased usable office space, we can enhance our supportive services and become a leader in meeting individuals' basic needs and transforming lives in the greater Pottstown community."

While PCRC has been successful for years distributing food, clothing and financial assistance, Wilhelmy said, "the new building provides the space needed to expand our supportive services. These are ultimately aimed at helping clients become more self-sufficient and better able to manage their households,

independent of the assistance offered at the Outreach Center."

## Pottstown Cluster Needs:

The Cluster has a "desperate" need for size 4, 5, & 6 diapers and wipes for all sizes.

There is a need for (gently used clothing) that meet the school uniform requirements: Khakis, Navy blue pants, White or blue polo shirts (with a reminder that some high school students may wear adult sizes, so they take any and all sizes)

Also, they are in need of Spring and Summer clothes for children (esp. sizes 2T and 12 months), Infant boy's clothes, and Size 10 boy's pants.

**Re-Creation** is a group of young men and women who give up at least a year of their lives to travel the country entertaining the men and women in our VA Medical Centers in all 50 states through song and dance. Re-Creation assumed full responsibility for the national VA program in 1983, and since then has attempted to raise necessary funding and present shows for Medical Centers nationwide. The young people in **Re-Creation** are not paid for their service. Arriving at the VA facilities four hours before show time... they set up...change into costumes...and visit hospital rooms and wards. Then they assist patients to the show area, perform for them, return them to their rooms, pack up and load equipment, and drive on, averaging 300 miles a day.

**Re-Creation will be at Cedarville on June 27<sup>th</sup>** – at the 11:00 service they will present their sacred program, **“Love”** – a vibrant worship service, celebrating God’s great promise of love! (There will be one service only that morning, followed by the church picnic.) The sacred program is designed as a worship service and features traditional hymns, praise & worship, and children’s songs - it is a live worship experience unlike any other!

That evening at 7:00 (Sunday 27<sup>th</sup>) they will present their secular show (with the same name as the sacred show), **“LOVE”** – the single greatest inspiration of popular music! Themes are: In the Mood, Gershwin Gala, Love Story, Country Lovin’, Freeway of Love, Lovin’ the King and Family Love. The show ends with an ardent patriotic finale honoring America, her people and her Veterans and Troops!

Be sure to plan on coming to their morning worship presentation as well as their

evening secular program!

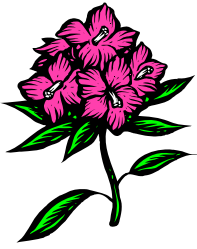
Dear Adult Fellowship Class,

Dear CUMC Members,  
The North Coventry Food Pantry would like to thank you for making us the recipient of your recent outreach efforts. We are very appreciative of \$350 you have sent our way. We deeply appreciate your continued support through out the past calendar year. It means a great deal to us, the volunteers who run the pantry, and those we serve.

The North Coventry Food Pantry currently has 80 families on our attendance roll. We serve on average 55 families during our monthly distribution. The pantry is opened to qualifying people the first Tuesday of each month from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. This past year, we began a night time distribution on that Wednesday evening immediately following the first Tuesday from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Each month, if we are lucky, we receive an allotment of state food and have come to rely quite heavily on donations from our community. \$5,000 is given to us each year from the State as well to buy provisions. We chose to buy meats, margarine, eggs and sliced American cheese with this money. It is given to us by the State to spend in quarterly allotments. Important to note, is

*the fact that the food pantry is run by dedicated volunteers who give freely of their time and talents. Our goal each month is to provide each family with toilet paper, a roll of paper towels and a bar of soap along with the state food and a bag of donated food. As our numbers rise, it is getting harder and harder to ensure a decent offering each month. Every little bit we collect goes a long way and we are extremely grateful for any effort put forth on our behalf.*

*Again, THANK YOU for making us a part of your community outreach efforts. We truly, truly appreciate it very much. We wish you peace, good health, harmony and economic prosperity this year.*
