A New Year, A New Thing

Scripture: "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." – Isaiah 43:18-19

As we step into 2025, I want to begin by expressing how grateful I am to all of you for welcoming me as your new pastor this past year. Your warmth, kindness, and faith have made the past year one filled with joy and blessing, and I am excited to journey with you into this new year of ministry together. As we do—the words of Isaiah offer us a profound invitation: to let go of what lies behind and embrace the new work God is doing in our lives. This passage reminds us that God is continually at work, crafting new opportunities, healing old wounds, and leading us into fresh paths of grace.

Each January, I like to take time to reflect on the past year and set intentions for the year ahead. It's a time to pause, pray, and listen for God's guidance. Isaiah 43:18-19 serves as a wonderful framework for this process. It reminds me to release anything from the past that holds me back and to remain open to the new thing God is springing up before me.

Think about the wilderness and wasteland mentioned in this passage. These are often symbols of desolation, confusion, or difficulty. Perhaps you're entering this year carrying the weight of last year's struggles—a wilderness of unanswered questions or a wasteland of missed opportunities. Yet, God promises to create streams of living water even in the driest places and a clear path forward in the most uncertain terrains.

This is not just a message of renewal but of partnership. "Do you not perceive it?" God asks. The challenge is not just to see the new thing but to believe it, trust it, and walk in step with the Spirit as it unfolds.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, as I enter 2025, help me to let go of the past and trust in the new thing you are doing in my life. Open my eyes to see your hand at work and my heart to believe in your promises. Lead me through the wilderness and refresh my soul with streams of your living water. May this year be a journey of faith, growth, and renewal in you. In Jesus' name, Amen.

May 2025 be filled with the fresh wind of God's Spirit guiding you into His promises and purposes!

Report from Rise Against Hunger!!

The meals you packed for Rise Against Hunger have shipped!!

Meals you packaged are headed to the Philippines! The Philippines consists of over 7.000 islands in the Ring of Fire in the Pacific Ocean. One of the most environmentally disease prone countries in the world. It faces near constant threats of natural disaster like earthquakes, typhoons, and volcanic eruptions. These disasters cause displacement and major loss of livelihoods and infrastructures, and disproportionately affect poor communities in rural areas, where people rely on

agriculture and fishing. The Global Hunter Index, which assesses food insecurity based on indicators that measure undernourishment and undernutrition, categorizes the Philippines as having a moderate level of hunger overall. Rise Against Hunger serves the regions of the Philippines where hunger is more urgent.

Your Impact:

To address some of the food security challenges that children, families and communities in the Philippines face, Rise Against Hunger partners with organizations that support educational programs by providing meals to children at schools and early child development centers. This is a key part of Rise Against Hunger's Nourishing Lives pathway. In some cases, the food children receive at school will be the majority of the food they eat in a day. The meals your packaged will help ensure that children have access to the consistent nourishment they need to live healthy lives and successfully pursue their education.

Thank you again for volunteering your time. The impact we are making together starts with a meal and leads to resilient communities worldwide.

I am also FAP (favorite aunt Peg) to 10 great nieces and nephews scattered across the US which allows many travel opportunities.


